Decorate stones with mineral sand

Instructions No. 1955

Difficulty: Beginner

Working time: 1 hour

Creating stones is great fun for young and old, because the stones can be decorated in many different ways. In our example, we have used stencils and mineral sand to transform self-cast concrete stones into maritime jewellery.



The stones are first poured by yourself. To do this, mix **concrete** with a little **water** to a creamy mass, which you **pour** into the **mould**. After **12 hours** of drying time, remove the stones from the mould. Sharp edges or unclean surfaces can be removed with **Sandpaper** can be edited

Protect your work surface with newspaper or a DIN A4 die **Stencil**The stone that you want to use is **wetted** from the back with spray glue **and placed** on one of the cast **stones**. The individual surfaces of the Stencil are brushed with mosaic glue. You should hold them Stencil with one hand so that they do not slip. Now sprinkle the **mineral sand** into the still wet glue. <u>Tip</u>: To obtain straight lines, you can **maskAdhesive tape** the mosaic with Stone masking tape. The stones can also be **covered** with natural stones **and shells** or decoratedPearl with a pen. In this way you can gradually cover all stones with the Sand and matching templates. The **surplus caSandn** be simply filled back into the can later

Important: The stencils and brush should be cleaned under clear water immediately after use.
