Pink Pouf

TENSION

11 tr x 7 rows = 15 x 15 cm

ABBREVIATIONS

sl stdcdouble crochetchchain

st(s) stitch(es) rd round

inc increase (2 tr in same place)

tr treble

NOTES

The pouf is worked in rounds. At the beginning of each round 3 chains that count as first treble crochet are worked. To make the change of the round a bit smoother you can follow this tip: 1 dc into the front loop of the 3rd chain (that counts as 1st treble) of the previous round, 2 ch. At the end of the round work the sl st through the two back loops of the 2nd ch. The new round starts again with a dc into the ch of the previous round. Thus the change of the round appears nearly invisible.

INSTRUCTION UPPER CIRCLE

Start with a magic ring and 8 dc. Each round is closed with a sl st.

Rd 2: 3 ch (count as first tr) +1 tr into first st, 1 inc in every st (16 sts).

Rd 3: 3 ch (count as first tr) +1 tr into first, 1 inc in every st (32 sts).

Rd 4: 3 ch (count as first tr), * 2 tr, 1 inc*, rep from * to * to last two sts, 2 tr (42 sts).

Rd 5: 3 ch (count as first tr), * 3 tr, 1 inc*, rep from * to * to end (52 sts).

Rd 6: 3 ch (count as first tr), *4 tr, 1 inc*, rep from * to * to end (62 sts).

Rd 7: 3 ch (count as first tr), * 5 tr, 1 inc*, rep from * to * to end (72 sts).

Rd 8: 3 ch (count as first tr), * 6 tr, 1 inc*, rep from * to * to end (82 sts).

Rd 9: 1 ch, 1 sl st in every st (82 sts). Don't close round with a sl st but take st off the needle, insert hook from behind into the sl st of the previous round, pull the st, which is off the hook, to the back, hook and st are on the back now.

Rd 10: 3 ch (count as first tr). Behind the sl st of the previous row there is a row of horizontal loops: 1 tr in every loop, close rd with sl st.

Rd 11 - 14: 3 ch (count as first tr), 1 tr in every st, end with sl st Cut yarn and weave in ends.

Base: Rd 1 - 9 same as upper circle, finish last rd with sl st. Don't cut yarn, it is needed to crochet parts together.

SEW INNER CUSHION

Before cutting the fabric please measure the diameter of your pouf. If it is a bit bigger or smaller, adjust the size of the inner cushion so that it fits perfectly.

CUTTING (1,5 CM SEAM ALLOWANCE IS INCLUDED)

2 rectangles: 59,5 x 35 cm 2 circles: Ø 39 cm

SEWING AND FILLING

The rectangles are sewn together on the short sides, leave an opening on one side of about 12 cm. Snip the seam allowance 0.7 cm all around the two circles and sew them to the body.

The cushion is filled through the opening on one side. Tip: Make a sort of piping nozzle out of plastic material and glue it to one corner of the bag with polyester beads, in which you cut a small corner. Insert the nozzle into the cushion and pour in the beads, best thing is when you have hands to help. Close the opening by hand stitches.

FINISHING

Place the inner cushion into the open pouf, base circle on top. Crochet the body and the base together with sl sts. To do so work through the front loops of the base and the back loops of the body. Cut yarn and weave in ends.

Note: Due to the fact, that Crafty Fine yarn is recycled from colour-assorted textile material and not re-dyed there can be slight variations in color and thickness. We therefore recommend buying enough yarn for your project. We also advise to use a crochet needle without handle, which is easier to work with. The first stitches might be a little bit hard to work, but you will soon get used, and the final result is worth it.

WASHING ADVICE

- Always wash in as warm a water temperature as possible up to the temperature recommended, with a short spin. Use a lot of water if hand washing. For darker colours we recommend the use of discolouration sheets.
- Do not bleach.
- Do not tumble dry. Drip-dry on a horizontal surface.
- Iron on a hot temperature setting using a damp cloth.
- Professional dry cleaning in tetrachloroethylene.
- Do not use optical brighteners (or any detergent containing optical brighteners). We recommend to use a softener to preserve the natural softness of the yarn.
