Shooting Star Wall Hanging

KNOTS USED

Half square knot or spiral knot Lark's head knot Diagonal double half hitch knots (see at the end step by step tutorials for these knots)

PREPARING OUR WORKSPACE

As the ropes are very long, it is advisable to hang the star and work while sitting or standing.

To let the star shine, you can attach a string of lights after completion.

BEFORE STARTING

Cut the following ropes:

- 1 x 820 cm colour 00105
- 8 x 220 cm colour *00105
- 6 x 295 cm colour *00105
- 4 x 360 cm colour *00105
- 8 x 220 cm Metallic gold **00302

STEPS

STEP 1. Attach the 820 cm rope to the star with a standard knot and make spiral knots on the 8 legs of the star. 2 legs of the star remain free. Trim the ends and secure with the hot glue gun.









 ${\bf STEP~2.}$ Attach the 295 cm ropes with the lark's head knot in the middle of the free legs.





STEP 3. Lay the right rope over the remaining ropes. Knot around this one. Knot a row of **diagonal double half hitch knots** from right to left.







STEP 4. Lay the left rope over the remaining ropes. Knot around this one. Knot a row of **diagonal double half hitch knots** from left to right.

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 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{STEP}}$ 5. Continue knotting in this pattern. Omit threads as shown in the pictures.







STEP 6. Attach the 200 cm ropes with the lark's head knot on the left and right side.



STEP 7. Knot 33 spiral stitches left and right.



STEP 8. Attach the 220 cm ropes with the lark's head knot in the gaps.



 ${\bf STEP~9.}$ Attach the 220 cm Anchor Metallic ropes with the lark' head knot between the pattern sets.

Cut all the ends into a V-shape and knot them up. To make the star even more exciting, you can knot a few ropes together as you like.

Note: Due to the fact, that Crafty Fine yarn is recycled from colour-assorted textile material and not re-dyed there can be slight variations in color and thickness. We therefore recommend buying enough yarn for your project. We also advise to use a crochet needle without handle, which is easier to work with. The first stitches might be a little bit hard to work, but you will soon get used, and the final result is worth it.

WASHING ADVICE

Always wash in as warm a water temperature as possible - up to the temperature recommended, with a short spin. Use a lot of water if hand washing. For darker colours we recommend the use of discolouration sheets. Do not bleach.

Do not tumble dry. Drip-dry on a horizontal surface. Iron on a hot temperature setting using a damp cloth. Professional dry cleaning in tetrachloroethylene.

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
MACRAMÉ KNOTS TUTORIALS STEP BY STEP

LARK'S HEAD KNOT

Step 1: Fold one strand (consisting of a filler strand and a working strand) in half and place the loop on top of a cord, a rod or a ring.

Step 2: Fold the loop down the back

Step 3: Pull the ends of the strand through the loop and pull tightly.



DIAGONAL DOUBLE HALF HITCH

From top left to bottom right / top right

Step 1: Take the first cord on the left (black) as the filler cord and the second cord (red) as the working cord. Place the filler cord over the working cord diagonally to the right. Loop the working cord around the filler cord.

Step 2: Loop the working cord around the filler cord again.


Step 3: Gently pull the working cord tightly and push both loops together.


Step 4: Use the next cord as the working cord and tie the next knot. Arrange this knot slightly lower/higher to create a diagonal line.

From top right to bottom left / top left

Step 1: Take the first cord to the right as the filler cord and the second cord as the working cord. Place the filler cord over the working cord diagonally to the left.

Step 2: Tie the knot as described above, but work in the opposite direction.





HALF SQUARE KNOT - SPIRAL SINNET

Step 1: The 4 filler and working strands are arranged parallel, the working strands A and D are on the outside and the filler strands B/C are in the

Step 2: Place D from right to left over B/C and under A.

Step 3: Bring A from left to right under B/C.

Step 4: Pull A from the back to the front though the loop created by D.

Step 5: Carefully pull A and D tightly.

The first basic knot is finished = 1 half square knot.


Step 6: Repeat the 1st basic knot placing A from right to left over B/C and under D.

Step 7: Bring D from left to right under B/C and pull from the back to the front through the loop created by A.

Carefully pull Aand D tightly.

The first basic knot has been repeated = 2 half square knots.

Step 8: Repeat steps 1 to 7 to create a spiral sinnet.
