KNOTS USED

Lark's head knot Square knot (see at the end step by step tutorials for these knots)

BEFORE STARTING

Cut the following:

- 12x 90 cm rope colour 00105
- 12x 30 cm Metallic gold yarn colour 00300

STEPS

Step 1: Take one of the 90cm lengths of rope, fold it in half and place the loop at the midpoint ring. Reverse lark's head knot repeat till all the pieces are on the hoop.



Step 2: Take the first 4 pieces and create a square knot. Repeat this process all the way around. Move on to the next set of ropes and make one square knot. Work your way around, creating one **square knot** with each new pair of ropes.





Step 3: Move on to the next set of rope and make one **square knot**. Work your way around, creating one square knot with each new pair of rope. For 2nd square knot in this round we are going to make some extra decorative loops, to create them all leave a 1cm (a little fingers width) gap between this knot and the previous. Then slide it up so the knots sit next to each other, creating loops.



Pull on the loops to tighten.

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Step 4: Then make one final **square knot** as normal. Make sure this last knot is tight. Repeat steps. Trim your ropes to 4/5cm.





Step 5: Take the 12 gold yarns and a make reverse lark's head knot in between every 2 macrame yarn to the wooden hoop. Take first 2 pieces of gold thread and create 20 mini square knots. When you reach the section with one square knot loop under and trim. Repeat this 5 more times.



Step 6: Last one leave the thread long to create the snow flakes hanging loop. Tie with knot to secure.

Note: Due to the fact, that Crafty Fine yarn is recycled from colour-assorted textile material and not re-dyed there can be slight variations in color and thickness. We therefore recommend buying enough yarn for your project. We also advise to use a crochet needle without handle, which is easier to work with. The first stitches might be a little bit hard to work, but you will soon get used, and the final result is worth it.

WASHING ADVICE

Always wash in as warm a water temperature as possible - up to the temperature recommended, with a short spin. Use a lot of water if hand washing. For darker colours we recommend the use of discolouration sheets

Do not bleach.

Do not tumble dry. Drip-dry on a horizontal surface.

Iron on a hot temperature setting using a damp cloth.



MACRAMÉ KNOTS TUTORIALS STEP BY STEP LARK'S HEAD KNOT

Step 1: Fold one strand (consisting of a filler strand and a working strand) in half and place the loop on top of a cord, a rod or a ring.

Step 2: Fold the loop down the back

Step 3: Pull the ends of the strand through the loop and pull tightly.



SQUARE KNOT – SQUARE KNOT BAND

Step 1: The 4 filler and working strands are arranged parallel, the working strands A and D are on the outside and the filler strands B/C are in the middle.

Step 2: Place D from right to left over B/C and under A.

Step 3: Bring A from left to right under B/C.

Step 4: Pull A from the back to the front though the loop created by D.

Step 5: Carefully pull A and D tightly.

The first basic knot is finished = 1 half square knot.

Step 6: Place D from left to right over B/C and under A.


Step 7: Bring A from right to left under B/C.


Pull A $\underline{\text{from the back to the front}}$ though the loop created by D.


Carefully pull A and D tightly.


The second basic knot is finished = 1 square knot.


